She extended her caring arms by working in respite care at Cambrian Home Health Care and of course being a care provider to her mother.

She loved her family dearly and her friends were her world. There was nothing that she would not do for the love of family and friends. “Oh how she loved to dance!” She would dance to anything with a beat.
